Mini-Project: Restaurant Menu with Description List

The client is a food truck owner who simply wants to put his menu on the internet, so his customers can use their smartphone to scan a QR code and look at the menu while they wait, to keep the line at his truck moving faster. He currently provides copies of a take-out menu, but the city is threatening to fine him for all the customers that drop the menus on the ground as litter.

His truck is called "Tasty Tres T's" which is a play on words for his main items: taquitos, tamales, and tostadas. The name of the food truck is where the fun stops: he stays polite but needs to get that line moving faster with no more paper mess! A clean, easy-to-read, and well-organized single webpage is all he wants. As a developer, a Description List (<dl>) structure is ideal for a menu. The rest of the structure and design is up to you. If you have extra time, he will pay extra for a great new logo too!
